September Report for Haverthwaite Sue Sanderson

I have been very busy over the last few months being responsible for the Council's response to CIVID 19 in the education sector. We had an education co-ordination group which we changed into a September planning group which met weekly and continues to do so. I chair that. We have representation from schools, academies, LEP, colleges and senior officers of the County Council. We had 17 workstreams covering curriculum, transport, staffing, HR, Health and Safety etc. We supported schools doing a range of risk assessments prior to the children returning to school. Transport has been especially challenging but we had been given additional funding which we used to support additional public service buses this will only last to half term. Schools have now returned but inevitably there are issues with suspected COVID cases. There are 9 schools affected so far. They have been externally triggered not in school but the social isolation is challenging staffing capacity etc. There are also issues with finance because of extra expenditure. Exams etc remain a challenge for the future and immediately for Y11.

Representatives of Staveley PC and ourselves are meeting Highways England and others late September virtually I can confirm issues at the Newby Bridge garage are being examined and we have had confirmation of funding for the compulsory left turn at the bridge at the Swan. Gordon should have received information re Gateway signage and Richard Rhodes will assist.
